## **ADJUSTMENT TO CHINA CUSTOMS ADVANCE MANIFEST (CCAM) REGULATION NOTIFICATION OF CHINA CUSTOMS ORDER NO. 56 (2017)**

In order to improve the capability to detect suspicious shipments prior to their physical entrance in China the China Customs Authorities (GACC) enhances Customs procedure by adding new security filing, consequently the authorities have unveiled Order No.56 (2017) which will adjust China Customs Advanced Manifest (CCAM) rule for both import and export. The new order will be effective from June 1, 2018 and includes the implementation of the followings:

### **MANIFEST SUBMISSION TIME**

#### For Import to China:

- 1) 24 hours prior to loading onto vessels for containership;  
24 hours prior to the first port of destination in China for non-containership
- 2) Before departure for flight transit time within 4 hours;  
4 hours prior to the first port of destination in China for the flight over 4 hours

#### For Export from China:

- 1) 24 hours prior to loading onto vessels for containership;  
2 hours prior to loading onto vessels for non-containership
- 2) 4 hours prior to loading onto the flight

### **REQUIRED (ADDITIONAL) DATA ELEMENTS**

- Shipper's Contact Name
- Shipper's Contact Number
- Shipper's Enterprise Registration Code or Unified Social Credit Code
- Consignee's Company Name
- Consignee's Contact Name
- Consignee's Contact Number
- Consignee's Enterprise Registration Code or Unified Social Credit Code
- Notify Party's Contact Number (if consignee is TO ORDER)
- Notify Party's Contact Name (if consignee is TO ORDER)
- Notify Party's Registration Code or Unified Social Credit Code (if consignee is TO ORDER)
- Complete and accurate brief description of goods

The regulation is applicable to all import, export and transshipped cargo via any China Ports (except Hong Kong). The advance manifest data must be reflected accurately
